Volunteers for Seniors Day begins its third decade

Twenty-one years ago, a small group of Christians from the Hong Kong Church of Christ stumbled upon an unmet need – elderly people living on their own needed help with cleaning and painting their homes, especially right before Chinese New Year. Since then, serving the elderly has been a major programme at HOPE worldwide.

Same same but different

Over the years, services on Volunteers for Seniors Day have evolved from painting and cleaning to fall prevention education and to helping the elderly fulfill a long-time wish. The volunteers have "evolved" too. Some of them started out as single people. Now they come with spouses and children. Some started out as babies, "volunteering" with their parents. Now they are the ones who climb up shelves and chairs to help with the cleaning.

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Hww: Were there any challenges during the process?

WH: Since I have volunteered with HOPE worldwide for over 20 years, I am very familiar with your services and organizational culture. You don't mind doing the challenging, let's-get-our-hands-dirty kind of work. However, members of my design team are all people twenty-something young with different backgrounds and personalities. They didn't necessarily grow up doing a lot of volunteering nor were they familiar with HOPE worldwide. The challenge was communicating your core values and culture to them, getting them to understand your mindset.

Hww: Where do you see this service/event headed in the future?

WH: Regardless of whatever I was going through in life at the time, volunteering on this day each year has always been one of the happiest occasions for me. I think a lot of volunteers feel the same way. I want them to feel proud that they are doing a great thing by coming out. For the future, I want to help build the sense that elderly and young people, volunteers and beneficiaries - we are all equal.

At the end of the day, we know that what's most important is that the elderly feel like their needs were met. We heard that many of them very much looked forward to the day. One woman shortened her time with family just so she could meet the volunteers. Another was ready with a note

of appreciation. Many were excited for a day out with the volunteers.

partners and all the sponsors who donated generously so that the lucky bags could be filled with goodies that the elderly would appreciate. Thank you for keeping this going! We are lucky to have you!

We Have Exciting News!

After about a year of discussion, research and proposal writing, we are pleased to announce that we will open our first two social enterprise dental clinics in Sham Shui Po and Kwai Tsing in the second half of 2017.

Two private donors generously gave HK\$2.4 million to fund the start-up cost of the two clinics. We aim to provide affordable quality dental care to residents of these two districts. The surplus from operating the clinics will be used to provide free dental care to poor elderly individuals not eligible for government subsidies.

Our teeth – something we usually take for granted

Our Elderly Programme staff Winnie's grandmother started losing her teeth when she was about 80 years old. By the time Grandma Cheung was 90, she had just three or four teeth left.

She didn't want to get dentures as she was worried about the cost. She also heard from other elderly friends that dentures were uncomfortable.

So how does she eat with just a few teeth in her mouth?

Grandma Cheung's choice of food, three times a day, was reduced to soft foods like tofu. If she were to take in "normal" food, it would have to be ground into tiny pieces.

She's reminded three times a day of the pleasure lost from not being able to eat normally. Her nutrition intake is also compromised.

The need

Winnie's grandmother is actually one of the lucky ones. Her family was able to afford the HK\$20,000 cost to get her fitted with dentures at a dental clinic nearby. For a poor elderly person who cannot afford the cost of dental care and who is ineligible for government subsidy, the HK\$20,000 might as well be HK\$2 million. Through our own research, we estimate that there are 250,000 such elderly persons in Hong Kong today.

Fulfilling the mission of healthy ageing

In addition to our Elderly Fall Prevention Programme (aiming to reach over a thousand elderly persons through 15 fall prevention education roadshows this year), the opening of the dental clinics will bring healthy ageing to many more of our elderly friends.
